Council Member Molina reported that at the August 22 Programs and Projects Committee Special meeting, the Board:

- Approved an additional \$3 million of Surface Transportation Program (STP) funds to complete the environmental document for Riverside County's Cajalco Road widening project;
- Approved an agreement with Caltrans to operate toll lanes on the Interstate
 15 Express Lanes for a period of 50 years;
- Approved \$8 million of Surface Transportation Program (STP) funds to close a funding gap for the construction of the I-215 / Scott Road interchange improvement project; and
- Lastly, approved contracts with two towing companies to continue Freeway Service Patrol (FSP) for a period of three years along State Route 91, State Route 91 Express Lanes, and State Route 60.

Riverside Transit Agency (RTA)

Council Member Molina reported that Riverside Transit Agency meetings were dark in August. However, RTA continues to seek input from the public on their First Mile-Last Mile Mobility Study. The study will identify challenges and offer solutions to passengers who travel to and from bus stops. The study will also look at ways to improve park-and-ride areas, drop-off locations, carpools, and bike share options. The overall goal of these improvements is to increase both ridership and City livability. The survey will be open until September 30. Safe Routes to School is working along-side the City and the School Districts to enhance the traffic circulation before and after school sessions. The goal is to educate the parents and students. Community Now did a video with MVTV that was shown at Back to School Nights to recommend procedures for safe drop off and pick up of students.

California State Parks is working on a new bussing program that would provide transportation from the Moreno Valley and Val Verde Unified Schools to Lake Perris for field trips to their museum and other amenities.
