# **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

# **Recommendation: That the City Council:**

1. By motion extend the terms of the three sitting Planning Commissioners and two Alternates till August 31<sup>st</sup> 2017, or till new appointments are made by the Mayor and approved by City Council, whichever comes first.

# **SUMMARY**

This report recommends that the Council by motion extend the terms of three sitting Planning Commissioners and two Alternates till August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017. This action would provide ample time for the appointment process to be concluded and maintain the composition of the Planning Commission till such appointments are made.

# DISCUSSION

Currently one vacant seat and three Planning Commissioners will have their terms expire on March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017. The two Alternate Planning Commissioners will end their term of service on April 28<sup>th</sup>, 2017.

Unless the terms are extended, the Planning Commission will have five Commissioners after March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017 and will lose its quorum on April 28<sup>th</sup>, 2017, when the two Alternates term-out. The loss of a quorum will disable the Planning Commission and approval process for development projects will either stall till appointments are approved by the Council, or the City Council will need to consider assuming the role of the Planning Commission for that period of time.

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The Council has the authority to extend the terms of the Planning Commissioners for the duration of the appointment process, as an interim measure. This action will not alter the Planning Commission terms set by the code and those will remain unchanged for the incoming Commissioners.

# **ALTERNATIVES**

- By motion extend the expiring terms of the current Planning Commissioners till August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017, or until Mayoral appointments are approved by the Council, whichever comes first. Staff recommends this alternative as it will provide more time for the appointment process to conclude, while preserving the current composition and functions of the Planning Commission.
- 2. Fail to extend the terms. Staff does not recommend this alternative for the reasons stated in the staff report.

# FISCAL IMPACT

There is no adverse Fiscal Impact arising out of the recommended alternative. Failure to extend the terms as recommended may result in negative Fiscal Impact due to possible delays in the development process and assumption of the Planning Commission functions by the City Council.
