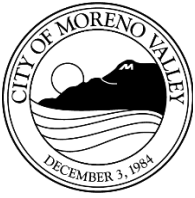

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Staff recommends that the Senior Citizens' Advisory Board receive and file this program update.

SUMMARY

- Senior Center attendance August 2023: 4,010, averaging 174 per day (July, 3,344)
- Senior Center membership (as of September 1, 2023: 3,015
- Meals delivered August 2023: 2,000 meals to 400 seniors, averaging 100 seniors per week.
- Hot lunches served August 2023: 2,129, averaging 92 per day.
- Feeding America distributed 350 non-perishable food boxes on August 10, 2023, Senior Center continues to lead the I.E., in boxes distributed to seniors.
- The Center continues to operate as a cooling center when temperatures are above 97 degrees. This will conclude on October 15, 2023.
- The Center's banquet room continues to average two rentals a month since January with two church rentals every Sunday.
- Healthcare agencies are available at the Center to discuss health care options, open enrollment is less than 2 months away.
- Friends of Moreno Valley continues its partnership with the Salvation Army to provide 36 seniors with perishable food items. Friends have also been providing free shuttle service to seniors for Parks & Community Services special events held in the evening.
- Friends of Moreno Valley continues to provide free coffee to the seniors daily.
- Haircuts continue to be full at the senior center every other Tuesday. Appointment required.
- Senior Soaring is available at the front counter.
- Senior Center is looking to add informational monitors in the lobby.
