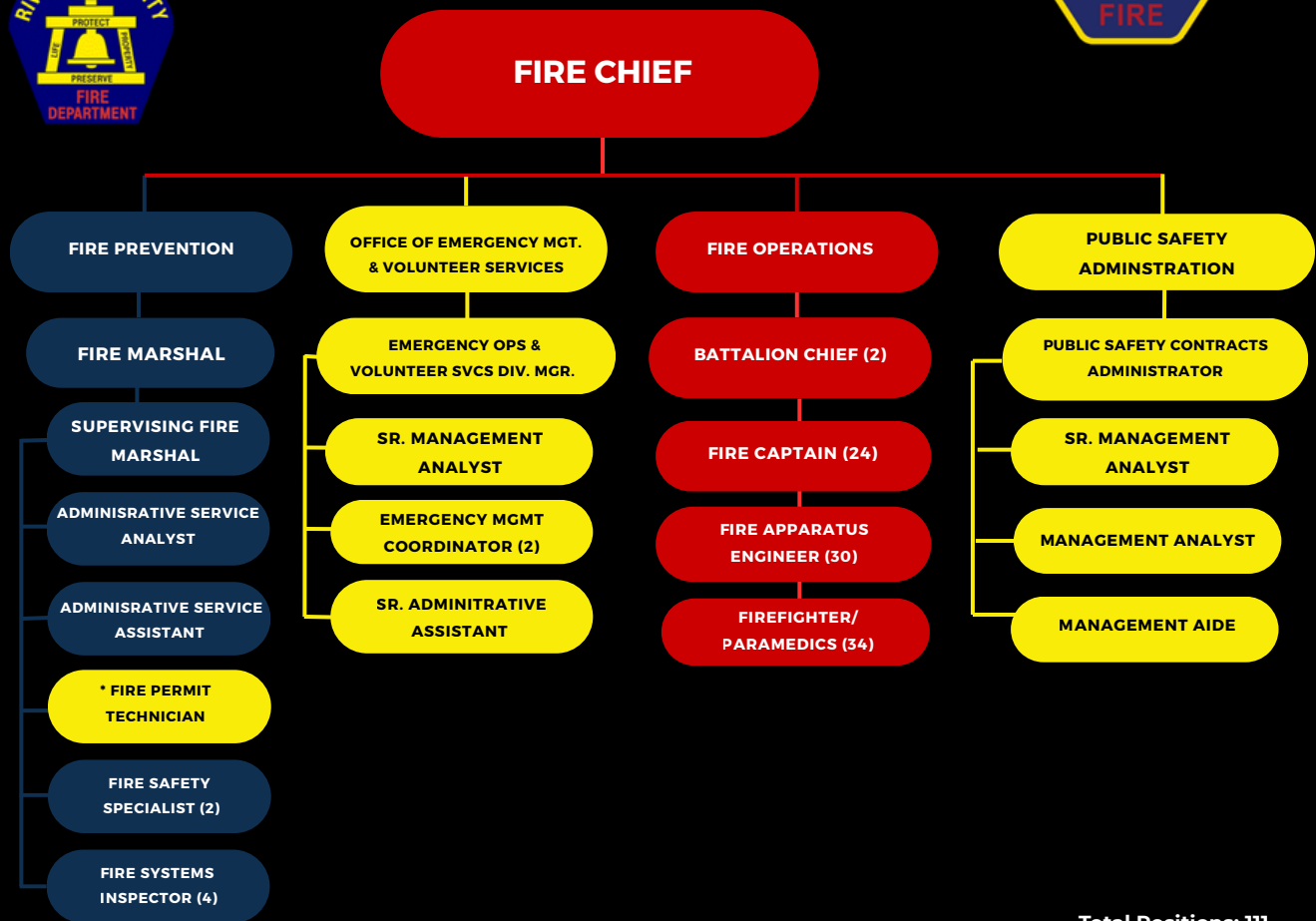

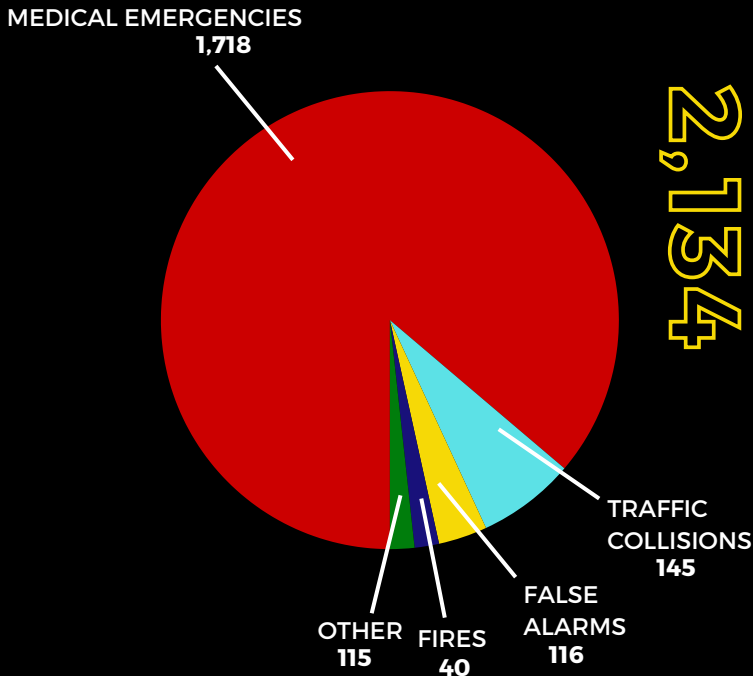

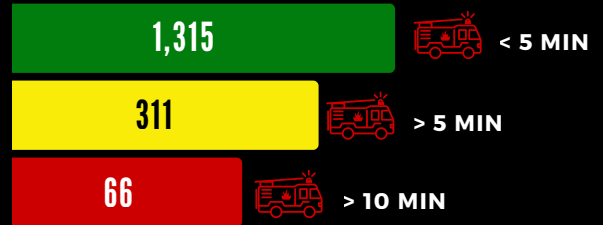

### SIGNIFICANT INCIDENT

On Saturday, May 23, CAL FIRE/Riverside County Fire Department responded to reports of a single-vehicle traffic collision at the intersection of Cottonwood Avenue and Dunhill Drive in District 1. Upon arrival, firefighters located one vehicle that had collided with a brick wall, sustaining significant damage. One occupant was found trapped inside the vehicle. Fire crews utilized specialized rescue equipment, including the Jaws of Life, to perform the extrication. After approximately 20 minutes, the patient was safely removed from the vehicle and transported by ambulance to a local trauma center with major injuries. The Riverside County Sheriff's Department is on scene and conducting the investigation. No firefighter injuries were reported.

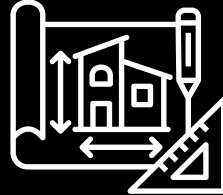
