AGING IN PLACE By Eva Courtney

Seventeen years have passed from the time when my best half and I bought our home in Moreno Valley. After retirement the home started to age together with both of us. My husband was handy in doing small repairs around the house. But my beloved handyman is not here anymore. After his death I continued to maintain the home. However, as I aged it became difficult to keep up with damage repair.

I was able to sprint up and down the main entrance steps. Not anymore. What I can do is limited due to cost putting a restriction. Another factor is inflation. It continues to gradually reduce my fixed income and emergency savings.

So, I accepted the responsibility to take care of the home and my car. I embraced the reality that some repairs I had to do myself. I knew how to use the hammer and was able to climb a ladder. I learned to use the drill gun and other tools. For repairs that required expertise You-tube became my best friend.

I kept my spirits up. I searched the internet. I approached the city for resources. The homework paid off. I found Habitat for Humanity. A nonprofit that assists to build a new home or to improve an existing one. I visited their office to inquire about qualifying. To my astonishment, I became a grantee.

The assistance I received to do minor repairs in my home and to add handrails at the entrance made a huge difference in my life. It is mentally and physically rewarding to live in a home that is safe, healthy and livable.

My children have less worries about me. They know that my world is not falling apart. At least, not yet. I am familiar with my local grocery stores. Finding a good match in-network dentist and primary doctor for my health was not easy. I found them and want to keep them for many more years. My social support is nearby at the senior center and at my church.

Knowing that I can continue to age-in-place gives me peace of mind.
